

DISTRICT ATTORNEYS AND THE ARREST-TO-DEPORTATION PIPELINE

DEPORTATION is a serious consequence of a conviction that extends beyond the hardship of a jail sentence. District Attorneyss can and should help noncitizens avoid such immigration consequences to keep families together.

WHAT POWER DOES THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY HAVE?

BRING CHARGES: Prosecutors decide who gets charged with which crime.

PURSUE CONVICTIONS: Prosecutors pursue and obtain convictions that may cause a defendant to be deported and/or ineligible for immigration benefits.

AFFECT COMMUNITY SAFETY: Prosecutors can promote community safety by seeking neutral case resolutions that won't cause deportations and ensuring their office is a safe space for all people, regardless of citizenship status.

THE DA'S OFFICE CAN PREVENT DEPORTATIONS BY:

- Requiring that prosecutors understand and consider the immigration consequences of criminal offenses in all their decisions.
- Having prosecutors work with defense attorneys to find immigration-neutral outcomes for noncitizen defendants.
- Offering programs that expand alternatives to convictions and incarceration.
- Increasing opportunities to erase the immigration consequences of old convictions.
- Proactively pursuing policies that advance immigrant rights and ensure all people feel safe and are treated with dignity, regardless of immigration status.
