Here are the new ground rules for our interaction with ICE.

In cases where we are aware of an inmate with an ICE hold whose release is scheduled (a sentenced inmate) or fairly predictable (a sentencing date) we will notify ICE by phone or email of the date and time, hopefully with at least 24 hours notice. (example- Sr. Garcia is scheduled for sentencing in County Court at 1100 tomorrow morning). Or (Mr. Medina will be released from his Pitco sentence at 0800 tomorrow morning). There is no reason why ICE cannot take custody of this person in our facility, provided that they are here to take the custody.

When someone is arrested, deemed to be in the country illegally, and an ICE hold is placed, that hold shall not impede that person's ability to post bond. If bond is posted, we will notify ICE of that person's next court date by fax or telephone. I believe ICE would prefer a fax.

If someone with an ICE hold gets adjudicated unexpectedly, we need to notify ICE immediately with that person's best local address upon release.

Please make every effort in this regard and extend all professional courtesy to the ICE agents.

We still need to work out is who is going to take charge of these notifications and I am open to discussion on what will be the most functionally efficient.
