

SEPTEMBER 2021 **PUBLIC CHARGE SOCIAL MEDIA EFFORT**

In 2020 and 2021, the ILRC generated three distinct social media pushes on public charge and four "breaking news" graphics to educate the immigrant community on policy developments and related issues. The first effort, which launched in February 2020, included 10 unique graphics in English and Spanish shared on Facebook and Instagram as timeline Posts and in Story feeds. This social media project, which debuted in advance of the implementation of the Trump DHS and DOS public charge rules on February 24, 2020, aimed to promote awareness and understanding of the new public charge rules and their impact on the community.

We launched a second social media effort in March 2020 on the intersection of COVID-19 and public charge. This project, which included 4 unique graphics in English and Spanish shared on Facebook and Instagram as timeline/grid Posts and Stories, was designed to promote the public health of the immigrant community by explaining that immigrants could access COVID-19 testing and treatment free of charge, without public charge implications, and without fear of U.S. Immigration Customs & Enforcement (ICE) presence at healthcare locations.

The third and final social media push launched in March 2021 to alert the community of the Biden administration's plans to undo the Trump public charge rules.
